

# **New Approach to Performing Arts Class Schedules**

#### 2013-2014 Schedule:

- 1. Classes met for 30 minutes daily during an advisory period, either at the beginning of the day or following lunch.
- 2. Entire grade level ensemble rehearsed at the same time (often 60-80 students).
- 3. Students not in Band or Orchestra were in advisory (which operated like a study hall).
- 4. Students in Band or Orchestra sometimes were required to attend advisory instead, for academic support, thus missing their performing arts class.
- 5. Small group pull-out lessons: met once a week for 50 minutes.
- 6. Students in Band and Chorus, or Orchestra and Chorus had to split time between the two.
- 7. Select Choir met once a week during advisory, lunch or after school.

#### 2014-2015 Schedule:

- 1. Ensemble classes meet during the Related Arts periods for 40 minutes every other day.
- 2. Grade level ensembles are divided into two groups so conductors are leading rehearsals of 30-40 rather than 60-80.
- 3. Students are able to take Band and Orchestra; Band and Chorus; or Orchestra and Chorus without having to split time.
- 4. Ensemble rehearsal time no longer competes with the advisory period or academic support.
- 5. Small group pull-out lessons: meet for 50 minutes at least once every two weeks.
- 6. Addition of Bandology and Spotlight on Strings as additional performance opportunities.
- 7. Select Choir now meets every other day throughout the year as full-fledged classes in 7<sup>th</sup> and grade, for students who audition and qualify.

## **Benefits for students:**

- 1. Each day students have the opportunity to take additional Related Arts courses.
- 2. Band, Orchestra, and Chorus now meet for 40 minutes which allows for more sustained rehearsal.
- 3. Since grade level ensembles are divided into two groups, the number of students the conductor is managing in each rehearsal is cut in half.
- 4. Band, Orchestra, and Chorus rehearsals now have their own time during the day; do not compete with advisory and do not follow lunch.
- 5. Students can take Band and Orchestra; Band and Chorus; or Orchestra and Chorus without losing time in one or the other.
- 6. Students who elect to do so now have the opportunity to take additional performance classes (Select Choir, Bandology, Spotlight on Strings).



# **New Approach to Fine Arts Class Schedules**

#### 2013-2014 Schedule:

- 1. Every student in grades 6-8 took Art 2D and Art 3D every other day for one marking period (22 classes).
- 2. Classes met for 50 minutes (1100 minutes total).

## 2014-2015 6th Grade Art Schedule:

- 1. Students can elect to take Art 2D and/or Art 3D.
- 2. Art classes meet for one semester every other day (45 classes).
- 3. Classes meet for 40 minutes (1800 minutes total)

## **Benefits for students:**

- 1. Increase of 700 minutes in each Art class a student takes in comparison to past years.
- 2. More sustained and deeper learning as a result of semester classes.

## 2014-2015 7th Grade Art Schedule:

- 1. All students take Art 2D for one trimester (33 classes)
- 2. Students can elect to take Art 3D for one semester (45 classes).
- 3. Classes meet for 40 minutes.
- 4. 1320 total minutes for required trimester Art 2D class.
- 5. 1800 total minutes for elective semester Art 3D class.

## **Benefits for students:**

- 1. More sustained and deeper learning as a result of trimester and semester classes.
- 2. Students interested in art can have more minutes in art than ever before over the course of the year.

#### 2014-2015 8th Grade Art Schedule:

- 1. All students take Art 3D for one trimester (33 classes)
- 2. Students can elect to take Art 2D for one semester (45 classes).
- 3. Classes meet for 40 minutes.
- 4. 1320 total minutes for required trimester Art 3D class.
- 5. 1800 total minutes for elective semester Art 2D class.
