- Tuesday, February 23<sup>rd</sup>, 3:30 to 6:30 p.m., Essex County Hall of Records Complex, Employee Parking Deck, 50 West Market Street, Newark
- Thursday, February 25<sup>th</sup>, 3:30 to 6:30 p.m., Essex County Department of Public Works, 99 West Bradford Avenue, Cedar Grove
- Saturday, February 27<sup>th</sup>, 8 a.m. to 12 noon, Essex County South Mountain Recreation Complex, Commuter Parking Deck, 560 Northfield Avenue, West Orange
- Essex County residents with or without symptoms are encouraged to get tested.
- Residents **age 8** and older are welcome to get tested.
- Residents are encouraged to get retested if they have been tested 14 days ago or more and have received negative test results or are asymptomatic.
- Testing is provided free of charge to Essex County residents. No insurance is required.
