- This data will not match any other report since cases are continually entering the system and local health departments may reassign place of residence as appropriate during their investigations.

Essex County Public Health Recommendations

- Get a flu shot! It's best to get vaccinated in September or October, but you can get vaccinated into January.
- Wear a cloth or disposable mask when in public (both indoors and outdoors).
- Practice social distancing (keep a 6-foot space between you and others).
- Follow good respiratory hygiene recommendations.
- Cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue or sleeve, not your hands.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water. Use alcohol-based hand sanitizer if soap and water are not available.
- Stay home if you are sick and avoid sick people.
- Review and follow CDC travel advisories when planning travel. If you become ill after returning home to the United States, call your healthcare provider before going to a doctor's office or emergency department of a hospital. Wear a cloth or disposable mask when entering the building to protect others.
